That means pooling and sharing capabilities, setting priorities and coordinating efforts better. Without open and pragmatic dialogue between government officials, defense experts, large, medium or small businesses, intelligence agencies and military authorities these challenges simply cannot be met.

In short: we must understand each other in order to learn from each other. To find answers.

And an answer is not a single thing, a lonely eureka moment, a flash of insight.

Answers derive from a network of elements that work together to give us a new pattern, a new and innovative solution to complex problems.

This is what we aim here.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I would like also to invite you to visit our booth in which you can observe some of the most successful research and development Armed Forces projects promoted by the Minister of Defense as result of a fruitful cooperation between the Portuguese Armed Forces, Defense Industries, and Academics.

Projects that provide a piece of the global answer we all aim and hopefully trigger the interest of industry partners.

For I do not believe that each one of us alone and separated has the answer but a small piece of it, a small piece that put together with someone else's own piece of the puzzle and so on and so forth will lead to the complete answer and a collective eureka moment.

If the challenge at hand is our Goliath, let's think about moments like these as our slingshots and the answers we find together the small rock that will bring the giant down.
